Watch our new video explaining the Indoor Air Quality Guidance

Over the last couple of months, we have been working on a special video to help explain the <u>IAQM indoor air quality (IAQ) guidance</u>, which was introduced in September 2021. The guidance was introduced as part of the IAQM's extended focus to include both indoor air quality as well as outdoor air quality in its remit, due to its increasing importance and relevance.

The guidance acts to assist members using a risk-based assessment methodology, looking at source, pathway and receptors and is applicable to new and existing buildings, whether they be commercial, residential or retail etc. It is a simple to use but comprehensive guide which provides practical advice on how to monitor, model, assess and mitigate indoor air quality.

The video features insights from industry experts, Claire Holman (Air Pollution Services and Chair of the working group) and Patrick Harland (Ricardo) on how the guidance should be implemented and their experience using it.

Measuring Air Quality 2023

The first big conference of the year, the <u>Measuring Air Quality Conference (MAQ23)</u> was held on the 28th March at Coin Street Conference Centre in Central London, featuring a variety of incredible talks from speakers covering a wide range of sectors and specialisms.

The event provided an excellent opportunity to share experiences of using new measurement techniques whilst exploring ways to interpret data collected by analysers in a variety of environments.

Feedback from the event was overwhelmingly positive. Attendees stated that the conference completely met their expectations, the speakers on the day were engaging and the presentations were informative and interesting.

Industry Updates & Resources

Revised national air quality strategy consultation

In April 2023, Defra launched a public consultation into the new Air Quality Strategy, which sets a framework to enable local authorities to deliver for their communities and contribute to our long-term air quality goals, including new targets for fine particulate matter (PM_{2.5}).

The consultation, which closed at the end of April, was fed into by the IAQM among a number of other industry organisations. The UK Government has now responded to the feedback, and you can read the <u>summary of</u> <u>responses and the government response</u> <u>here</u>.

Clean air (Human Rights) Bill -(Ella's Law)

The Clean Air (Human Rights) Bill, or 'Ella's law' is currently sitting in the House of Commons with the aim of it being enshrined in law. It would provide additional powers in the UK to ensure pollutants and pollution limits are reviewed and monitored in line with the minimum WHO standards.

SAMHE Project

The SAMHE (Schools' Air Quality Monitoring for Health and Education) project is a citizen science project being run in schools across the UK to establish a network of air quality monitors. The network will record measurements of CO₂, VOCs, PM_{2.5}, temperature and relative humidity.

This scheme is supported by the Department of Education and a number of leading academic bodies and is actively encouraging schools to sign up.

Imperial College London / GLA – Review

Imperial College London in conjunction with the Greater London Authority (GLA) undertook a review into the lifelong health impacts of air pollution.

The review highlighted a number of serious health risks due to air pollution and how it can affect both mental and physical health, from pregnancy and birth through to child development and into adulthood.

UK Chief Medical Officer Annual Report 2022

The UK's Chief Medical Officer produced their annual report late last year, with a key focus on air quality. The report highlights solutions across different sectors and demonstrates that we need to continue to be active in reducing outdoor air pollution.

It also highlights that indoor air quality is becoming an increasing issue, and calls for more attention and research into preventing and reducing indoor air pollution.

Endorsed Courses and CPD Opportunities

The University of Birmingham University are running a fellowship, <u>The McCall MacBain Clean Air Fellowship - The Next Generation of Clean Air Leaders</u>. Five applicants will be selected to pursue an IAQM accredited master's degree in Air Pollution Management and Control, with the fellowship covering course fees and a stipend to cover living and travel costs.
